### **GENERAL ELECTIVES**



**AVID**-For rising 8th grade students that have already applied and been accepted. This course is designed to support motivated, capable students in pursuing a rigorous course of high school study leading to acceptance to and success in a four-year college or university. Through a variety of instructional techniques, students develop skills in higher-level thinking, writing across the curriculum, and reading strategies for accessing challenging course material. In addition, students participate in college, career, and cultural exploration activities, including field trips.

**Career Investigations (NEW)**-This course is designed to help students identify and demonstrate the workplace skills that employers desire in their future employees. Students analyze their personal assets; explore career clusters, career pathways, or occupations; and draft an Academic and Career PLan based on their academic and career interests

**Leadership**-For students interest in initiating, organizing, and participating in school sponsored events to promote service learning, improve school climate, and foster a sense of community
